Kaleideum Joins Museums for All

As of January 1, 2018, Kaleideum has joined *Museums for All*, a signature access program of the Association of Children's Museums (ACM) and the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) that encourages families of all backgrounds to visit museums regularly and build lifelong museum habits. The program enables families to visit Kaleideum for a minimal fee of **\$3** per person upon presentation of an Electronic Benefits Transfer (EBT) card.

Museums for All is part of Kaleideum's broad commitment to seek, include, and welcome all members of our community. This program represents a long stride toward the goal of reaching more children and families with the valuable learning resources of museums while helping them build the skills for future success.
